Governing Board's Report

- Andy McCurdy/Heather Wright
 - Andy and Heather were not able to attend this meeting.
 - Mrs. Wahl provided a recap of the last meeting.
 - Jean Hatch received a Green Apple award.
 - Recap of the float for the Christmas Light Parade, the float won 3 awards at the parade in 2018.
 - Salary schedule was discussed
 - RSA has been unable to give teachers salary increases based on the states recommendation due to budget constraints. This issue has been presented to the budgetary staff for review and solution.
 - The board received a donation from a family at RSA in the amount of \$20,000
 - Funds to be allocated to the after school program, the arts and the strings program.

Administrator's Report

- Mrs. Wahl
 - Open house will be held Thursday, February 28th, 2019
 - NWEA testing has been moved up to an earlier date so that results can be shared with parents during open house.
 - The all school campout will no longer be a campout, the reasoning behind the switch is due to the size of the school and the limited access to venues that can accommodate a group of our size. There were also many suggestions from parents expressing their desire for a change of format.
 - Next year there will be an Arts and Culture evening held in place of the campout. There will be art activities and a picnic like atmosphere with food trucks etc.
 - 8th grade promotion will be held Tuesday June 4th due to Foothill graduation ceremony being held on Wednesday June 5th
- The California School Dashboard was presented to parents.
 - Schools are rated and compared against themselves not necessarily other schools in the area. There are 10 different categories that schools are being rated on, each category can be viewed independently. Some of these categories include: School Population, Academic performance, Local indicators, Chronic Absenteeism

Teacher's Report

- Mrs. Brown provided a teachers report, the staff is busy chugging along for the year. The musical was a success. There is an art show at Shasta County office of Education with art from both Mrs. Brown and Mrs. Lindburghs students.
