Hat Creek (K-8 Fieldtrip) Sept. 15

Parent Information & Schedule

Hat Creek Campground is located 1 mile west of the town of Old Station, and 12 miles east of the NW entrance to [Lassen Volcanic National Park](#). The town of Burney is 26 miles north.

General Helpful Information

- Parking will be tight, so PLEASE carpool if at all possible. Non-campers may want to park at the Visitor's Center and carpool or shuttle groups in.
- When you park at the Group Site area, please park diagonally when possible to accommodate more cars.
- Wear comfortable shoes as you may need to park across the Hwy at the Spattercone parking lot and walk in. It is .6 miles to Group Site 2.
- Water and restrooms are plentiful in the campground, but students should bring water on hikes. Sunscreen, hats, and good closed toed shoes are advised.
- Parents are responsible for bringing their students' own medications, not the school- Parents can drop off medication with staff members leading their child's group.
- Families will want to bring folding chairs and/or blankets for the sing-a-long.
- The temperature is very cool in the morning, 50 degrees, and cools off quickly in the evening-bring sweatshirts and/or jackets.
- Pets:-- we suggest you do not bring them, but if you do, they must be on a leash at all times and picked up after unless they "go" in the Pet Area.
- Safety Alerts:—the creek flows along one side of the campground. It will be cold, but shallow in most places. Families are to supervise children at all times. We have been advised that meat bees or poison oak may be present, please consider bringing any necessary medications/ repellents to address these concerns. Fire and EMT is only 5 min. away.
- Camper's tip for keeping meat bees away-place dryer sheets such as Bounce or Downy around your site.
- Flashlights are advised for camping and Subway Caves.
- There will be high fire danger. Burning only in fire pits and BBQs is permitted. Fires need to be dead out, of course. Families should bring their own wood, but are allowed to pick up and use pine cones, sticks on the ground, or pine needles to start your fire.
- Print out the Fee Waiver to get into Lassen Volcanic National Park. See below: Display Waiver on the dashboard of your vehicle in order to enter the park without being charged.
- Expect to have an AWESOME time!

Students need to complete a minimum of 6 activities then give it to their homeroom teacher for attendance. Students remain with parents during the entire activity time. Staff and Students (with their parents) have lunch at the designated lunch time.

Teacher Led Activities Grades 3-5

10:30-1:30 Grades 3-5 student activity time; Ranger presentation, hikes, and activities will be led by classroom teachers at the hike locations listed below. Parents are responsible for transporting students to **Lassen Park**. Parking is available at Loomis Museum, Manzanita Lake boat launch, and Campground store . The 4 /5 group should park at the Manzanita lot. More spaces are available there.

3/ 4 (Martin, Deng, Zimmerman homerooms) will meet at the **Loomis Museum Plaza** for attendance.

4/ 5 (Scott, Nichols, Wong Homerooms) will meet for attendance at the **Amphitheater** near Manzanita Lake campground.

Students should eat their snack before arriving and bring a sack lunch and water bottle . They will have a short, designated lunch time between the Ranger presentation and hike. Students should wear a hat and closed toed tennis shoes.

Group B will complete art activity and take part in fishing station

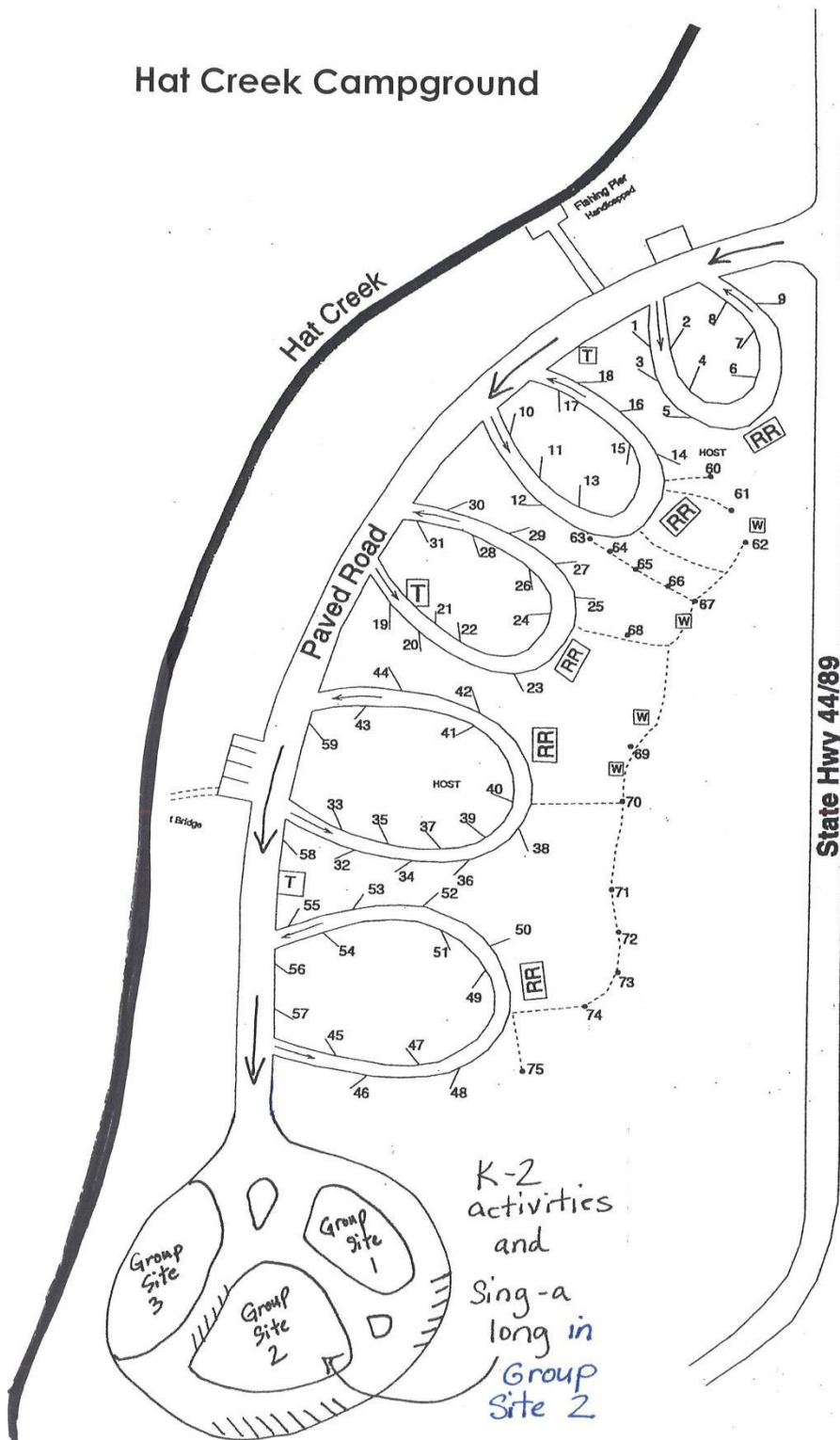
