Making rehearsal and performance dates a priority and understanding that outside
interests such as piano lessons, voice lessons, dance lessons, other shows, and sports
are not excused absences unless already discussed with my directors. I understand
that my grade may be affected by unexcused absences from after school, Saturday,
and evening rehearsals and performances.
Being respectful to my directors, parent volunteers, staff members, and peers. I
understand that I must abide by the Family & Student Handbook behavior
expectations as outlined in the RSA Code of Conduct.
Keeping my grades at a "C" or higher in each class or risk being put on academic
probation. I understand that I may be removed from the cast and placed in study hall
if I do not maintain a 2.0 grade average as required by the RSA K-8 Family Handbook.

Auditions

Auditions will take place on Tuesday, August 26 from 3:00-5:30pm and Thursday, August 28th from 3:00-6:00pm. Callbacks will be Friday, August 28th from 3:00-6:00pm. Follow these steps to successfully complete the audition process:

- 1. Complete the Audition Registration Form. Student and parent/guardian should set aside 20-25 minutes to sit down together and fully read and complete the online registration form. Registration forms can be found at https://forms.gle/buAHXS58R5JGUJ2i6 or by scanning the provided QR code. You will need your family calendar, parent/guardian cell phones, and a credit card to complete the registration process. If you have any trouble completing the registration form, please email the Production Assistant at production@promotingartsnow.org.
- 2. **Sign up for an audition slot**. Upon submission of your Audition Registration Form, you will see a confirmation page with a link to the Audition Sign Up Genius page. Click on this link to access the online sign-up sheet and sign up for a five-minute slot.
- 3. **Attend your audition.** Arrive 10 minutes early for your audition with your audition materials. Check in with the parent volunteer in the RSA amphitheater, and wait patiently for your name to be called. Auditions are closed; parents/guardians can wait in the lobby for their child.
- 4. Callbacks: Some students will be asked to attend Call Back auditions on Friday, August 29th. Callbacks will be posted to Remind and on Ms. Stoxen's web page. Callbacks will involve different groupings of students reading different roles to see what the best mixture of cast members will be to make a great show! Students who are called back should plan to stay until about 6pm, though some may be dismissed earlier than that. Please bring a healthy snack and something quiet to do when you are not actively auditioning. When a pick-up time is determined, show directors will notify families via Remind that they should start preparing to pick up their student(s).
- 5. **Celebrate!** This process is designed to identify the best individuals for each role in the show. Each and every cast member is important for telling the story and entertaining our audience. Thank you for your support!

Mandatory Rehearsals:

Rehearsals outside of school hours are included as part of the participation grade for this class. A call sheet for the upcoming week's rehearsals will be sent via email and Remind, posted to Ms. Stoxen's website, and posted on the wall in Room 19 by Thursday of each week. Plan to be at <u>all</u> Monday and Saturday rehearsals. You may occasionally be dismissed from one or more of these rehearsals depending on which scenes are being rehearsed that day. Attendance at all rehearsals is <u>mandatory</u> and extremely essential to the show's success! PLEASE mark these on your calendar NOW and prioritize them as a family.

Required Materials:

Cast members will need to bring their script, a non-spill water bottle and dance shoes to ALL rehearsals. Students should also bring a snack for afternoon rehearsals and a sack lunch for Saturday rehearsals. Lunch will not be provided during Saturday rehearsals.

Matilda Master Calendar of Events:

We do our absolute best to set the rehearsal schedule for the entire year before production begins. If at any point we need to adjust the rehearsal schedule, we will let you know as soon as possible through the **Remind** app and by emailing an updated version of the rehearsal schedule documents.



Drama & Set Design Participation Fee:

These fees also help to cover the cost of cleaning and maintenance on our costumes. Please note that this year ALL Matilda Jr. participants, including cast members and set design students are asked to pay the costume fee. Set design students' costume fees will cover the cost of

Please drop off students **IN FRONT** of the school. Students will enter via the door into Room 19 (to the left of the main lobby doors). All rehearsals are **CLOSED**, which means parents may not enter the building with their students. Any forgotten gear, lunches, or other items dropped off during rehearsals must be handed to the parent volunteer at the door; please label anything being dropped off with student name so it gets into the right hands! Rehearsal pick up will always be IN FRONT of the school, not on the side lot near the activity center.

Please be patient, safe, and ON TIME!

Cascade Drop-off and Pick-up:

Carpooling is encouraged! The Cascade Theatre is located at 1731 Market St in downtown Redding. All students must be dropped off and picked up from the stage door on the north side of Cascade between the theatre and the US Bank parking lot. From Market St, enter the US Bank driveway to the left of the Cascade and drop off your student at the chain link gate to your right. Please DO NOT drop off or pick up your student at the front door on Market St. When waiting to pick up your student, DO NOT idle in the

street on Market or Placer Streets, even if a line has formed there. Find a place to park and walk up to sign your student out or wait for the traffic to clear before driving up. Please be aware that street parking fees apply in certain parts of downtown before 6pm on weekdays. Please be patient at pick up and drop off so that we can keep all of our students safe.

A letter from our Costumer:

August 2025

Hello Parents!

I am looking forward to working with your student during this year's production of Matilda, Jr. I know you will probably have a lot of questions as the show develops, so we are reaching out now to give you our contact information and answer a few frequently asked questions.

- Once students are cast in their roles, we will be measuring them for costumes. We will
 notify parents when this fitting session will take place; an RSA staff member will be
 present and parents may be present if they want. On the fitting day, please make sure
 the students bring tight-fitting clothing to school to change into before trying on
 costumes.
- When dress rehearsals begin in January, students MUST have the appropriate undergarments. For boys, spandex shorts and a tight-fitting tank top. For girls, a nude leotard (NO clear straps as they reflect the lights on stage) or nude dance shorts and tank/camisole (NO clear straps as they reflect the lights on stage) are required. These can be purchased at the local dance stores or online. This is especially important for lead roles as they could potentially have side stage costume changes.
- Shoes and socks/tights will vary depending on the role your student has been cast. We will have this information out to you as soon as possible, after casting is complete. Shoes should be acquired before December 1, 2025. Students are encouraged to have their shoes as soon as possible so that they can begin practicing in them during drama class at school. All dance shoes look alike, so it is important to have students write their name inside their shoes using a sharpie. Dance shoes can be expensive and get left behind frequently, so labeling is essential!
- More information will be coming in future months about hair, make-up, and backstage necessities for during performances.
- Many hands make light work. There are a variety of opportunities for you to help with costumes and earn volunteer hours, both on campus and off. You don't have to sew to be a help in this area! Please reach out if you would like to fulfill your volunteer requirements in the costume department.
